a. UPDATE: ANIMAL CONTROL— Robbie Chartier

That the Board of County Commissioners receive an update on the Animal Control operations and consider whether or not to reduce the adoption fee to assist reducing the population at the shelter.

b. SUSPENSION OF IMPLEMENTATION OF SOCIAL MEDIA POLICY— Mariah Anuez

That the Board of County Commissioners suspend the implementation of the Social Media Policy adopted June 22, 2017 due to the objection of the IAFF Union and to treat all County Employees fairly and equitably with regard to conditions of employment; and that the BOCC take no further action to formally change any policy contained in the Employee Handbook until negotiations are opened on the IAFF Union contract in January 2018 and if any provision of the Employee Handbook is declared invalid by a court action, state law or federal law, the remaining parts or portions of the Employee Handbook should remain in full force and effect; and director the County Administrator to have the Employee Handbook reviewed for legal sufficiency.

c. HEALTH INSURANCE FUNDING FOR FISCAL YEAR 2017-18— Mariah Anuez
